Where to start:

<p>1. Look up the performer, group, or topic in <i>The Encyclopedia of Popular Music</i> (Reference - ML102.P66G84 2006 v. 1-10) or <i>Continuum Encyclopedia of Popular Music of the World</i> (Reference - ML102.P66C66 2003 v. 1-7). Also consult other popular music encyclopedias, discographies, and histories in the Music Library Reference Room (areas are listed to the right).</p>	<p>Popular Music Encyclopedias – ML102.P... <p>2. Consult the electronic Music Databases accessible via the link from the Music Library homepage. These databases index articles originally published in print sources. We suggest you search in this order: <i>Music & Performing Arts Online</i> – The full-text of many journal articles are available on this database. If there is not a link to the full-text of the article you desire, you will need to determine whether or not the library holds the journal by searching for the <u>journal title</u> in the online catalog. <i>Academic Search Premier</i>– This multidisciplinary database provides full-text for over 3,900 scholarly publications. <i>RILM Abstracts</i> - While this database does not offer full-text articles, the abstracts should allow you to determine whether the article will be useful. <p>3. Use the Reference Room computers to search the Online Catalog for books on your subject. <p>4. Go into the Music Library stacks and browse the areas listed to the right for books that might contain references to your subject.
