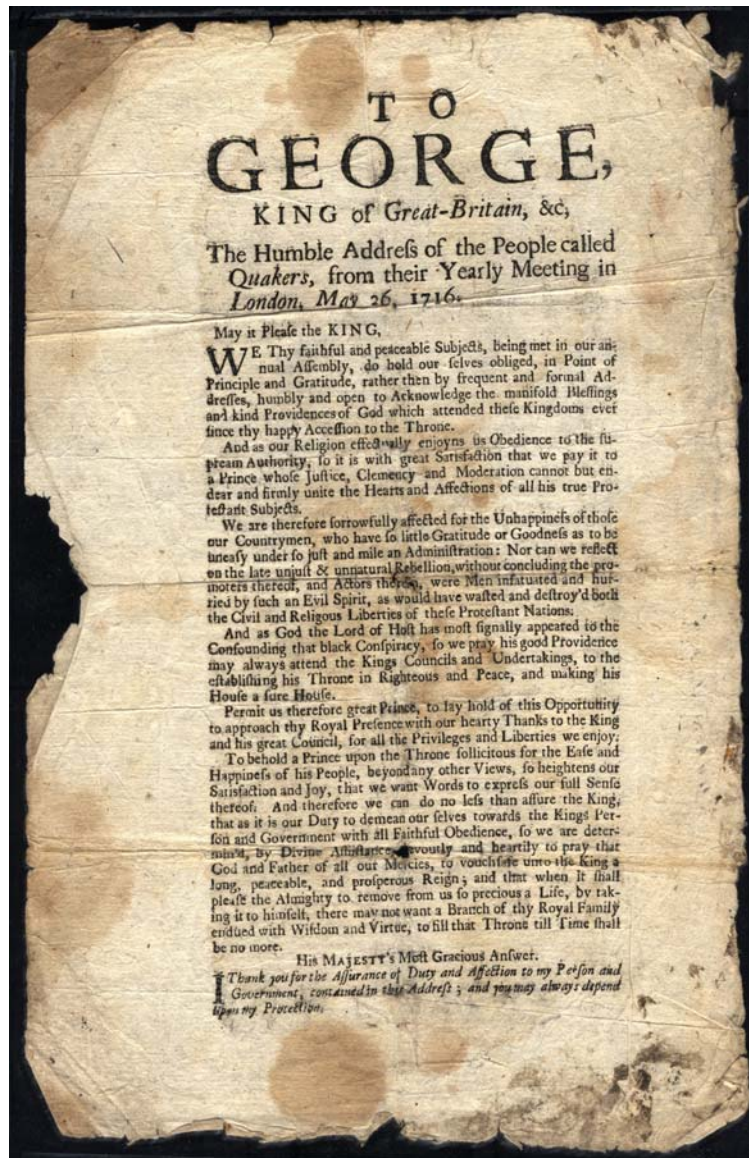


RELIGION IN AMERICA: THE SOCIETY OF FRIENDS



The religion holdings of the Special Collections Library are notable for the remarkable array of titles relating to the Friends, or “Quakers.” Not only the record of the Society in America, but of the antecedent movement in the British Isles and the relations between the two, is conspicuous.
