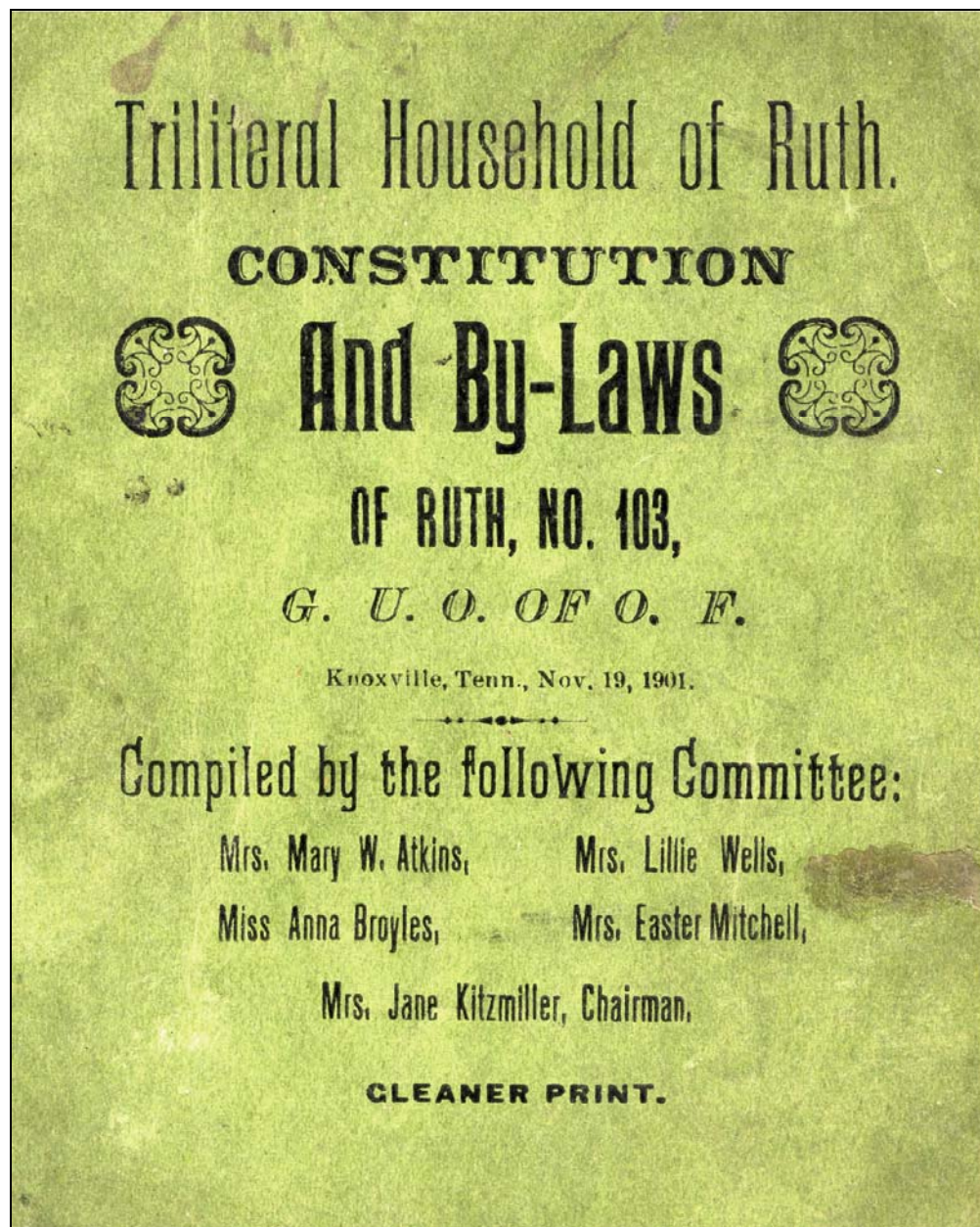

Introduction

This bibliography outlines the Special Collections Library's holdings documenting women's history, influence, and experience in the Southeastern United States. It includes resources regarding prominent American and Native American women, items documenting numerous women's clubs and associations, descriptions and analyses of women's lives in the Southeast, and serial publications marketed specifically to women. Although it is not intended to provide a comprehensive list of the Library's holdings on the topic, this bibliography provides a representative sample of the material available.

For more resources related to women's history at the Special Collections Library, please consult the other Women's Studies Bibliographies, including:

- Legal and Political Issues (documenting women's traditional roles, women's legal status, women's suffrage, the temperance movement, the League of Women Voters, the women's liberation movement, and women politicians and lobbyists.)
- Women's Education (including materials documenting women's experiences as students and teachers on both the primary and secondary levels.)
- Women and Religion (including materials documenting women's evangelistic efforts, missionary activities, travel to sacred places, and portrayal in the Bible and in sacred history.)
